Confirmation

I have had approaches from one or two people interested in being confirmed. If you would like to explore this step - perhaps to learn more about Christian faith or because for whatever reason you do not receive holy communion - please let me know. Confirmation is an opportunity both to affirm your faith publicly and to invite the Holy Spirit to strengthen you in this. We admit children to receive communion after a short course (I plan to do another next year), so confirmation is a more adult step, though I am happy for anyone to consider it once they reach secondary school age. There is no upper age limit! Preparation will be tailored to meet the needs of those involved. *Rev'd James*
