#### Under Tree Schools: our charity of the month, educating girls in South Sudan

The academic education our girls get is very important to help them train for careers, rather than follow the old tribal tradition of raising a family from the age of about fifteen. But because of the current political chaos in South Sudan there is a very urgent priority. Much of the country is severely short of food. There are reports of starvation in parts of the Aweil region where the school is, though not close to the school. So we are very grateful to the World Food Programme for supplying the ingredients for the hot lunch each girl gets every day. UTS employs the cooks; and it pays for the lunch to include meat once a month. And our head teacher is a trained agronomist; he is teaching the girls how best to grow crops and look after cattle. Let us hope that the current rainy season produces a good harvest.

**More coffee Rector?** Hospitality and holy community go hand in hand, so I would like to see if there is any interest in gathering for coffee/tea before the Thursday 12 noon communion. From 5th September, I will have the kettle on in the Melvill Room from 11am each Thursday. It will be an opportunity for fellowship or for anyone wanting to have a word with me, and there will be no expectation of staying on for the Communion if that isn't possible. Quiet Time will continue in the church as now. I have found in previous parishes that a midweek communion with refreshments is helpful, especially for those who cannot get to the Sunday 10am, so I would like to give it a try here! James
